### From the Rector

It is wonderful to be restarting some social events at St John's. Things kick off with a congregational lunch after the service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> August. If we have an enthusiastic response, we will go ahead with a quiz night and a coffee morning later in the year. Of course, we took such events for granted in pre-pandemic times – they were simply part of our life as a church community – things we did together and which we invited others to come and enjoy with us. The restrictions of Covid and our subsequent hesitancy to engage in anything outside our homes have given our confidence a knock. There are few people that I speak to across the age range, who do not report that they are going out less, that they have got out of the way of socialising with others.

Yet we are such social beings, and each one of us is only one part of the reflection of the great mystery of God. We are each of us simply one fingerprint or footprint of God. We are essentially connected with one another. We were reminded of that in the early days of the pandemic when it was so obvious that we rely on many key workers. But it is not just the essentials of food and water, bin collections, health and social care staff or someone filling the shelves at the supermarket. It is also vital for us to make connection with others for our social wellbeing. The everyday face to face banter with friends brightens our day often without us realising it.

We are bombarded with the bad news stories from the television, newspapers, and social media. It is friends that often 'top up' our batteries, and we are refreshed with a laugh or a shared memory. Despite all the things going on around us it is a benevolent universe, and God is on our side, especially through relationships. During the apostle Paul's lifetime, the church was not yet an institution or structural

grouping of common practices and beliefs. The church was a living organism that communicated the gospel through relationships.

We are all familiar with Paul's brilliant metaphor for this living, organic, concrete embodiment of the Body of Christ: "For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another. Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us exercise them" (Romans 12:4–6). At the heart of this body, providing the energy that enlivens the community is "the love of God that has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5). Let us



share this love in our community of St John's and enjoy company over lunch. I look forward to seeing many of you then.




Expose the pride in humility's clothing of sitting back as if we could do nothing And the folly disguised as wisdom of delay, and 'bit by bit'.



Michael Hill, I am sure, would have been happy to see St John's full to capacity on June 24<sup>th</sup> this year, but his modesty would probably have made him amazed that the crowd was actually there purely because of him. It was on that Friday that a Service of Thanksgiving celebrated a life closely associated with St John's, Michael Hill having been christened there more than 90 years ago. He was a notable member, including serving on the Vestry , as Treasurer, and even sang in the choir during his long life.

A mixture of songs, hymns and readings gave the congrega-

tion an insight to the life of a man who was both devoted to his family, and whose working life saw success that allowed him, along with Caroline Hill, to create and develop Murton Nature Reserve. This is now a lasting memorial to a wonderful person, and which fittingly was the venue for a reception held that afternoon. A cairn was constructed by those present as a tribute.

Personally I was unfortunate not to meet Michael Hill until he was well into his twilight years, but despite the short time I do feel privileged to have known him, however briefly.
